
The Yukon Literacy Coalition (YLC) and the House of Learning is offering Family Literacy programming for all ages.

KDFN Tutor

Home Maintenance and Repair Program

The Home Maintenance and Repair (HM&R) Program is a Northern Adult Basic Education program in partnership with Yukon College and Kenädän Ku House of Learning. It is being offered at the Yukon College Mobile Trailer located at KDFN Housing department's yard.

The HM&R program began March 4 and will be completed on June 14, 2013. There are 11 students attending, 8 are KDFN Citizens and 3 are other

Yukon First Nations. The first two weeks of training dealt with essential skills and safety awareness in the jobsite. During the course they will learn carpentry, plumbing, electrical and oil burner skills to properly maintain their homes.

The students completed their first project which was the production of sawhorses. Also, they are studying trades math and working towards their next project, which will be renovating a KDFN Housing unit.

Other possible training programs are life skills, pre-employment training, vocational training and professional training. Also, this program may cover clothing assistance for
