

Kwanlin Dün First Nation Plan Approval Policy

PURPOSE

- 1. The purpose of this policy is to:
 - a. Establish a process for the development, review, or amendment of a land use plan in fulfillment of Section 7 of the *Lands Act*;
 - b. Clarify the process by which the director submits a proposed plan to the Council for adoption, as required in Section 9 of the *Lands Act*.

SCOPE

- 2. In this policy, the phrase "land use plan" has the same meaning as it does under the Lands Act.
- 3. This policy applies to the development, review, amendment, and adoption of a land use plan or a proposed plan that may be adopted as a land use plan (a "proposed plan"), as the case may be.
- 4. A proposed plan is a plan:
 - a. that proposes to constrain the zoning or development of, or granting of an interest in Settlement Land; and
 - b. to which KDFN is a party, in whole or in part.

AUTHORITY

5. Standing Committee is responsible for overseeing the development of a proposed plan and the review and amendment of a land use plan in accordance with this policy and the general rules and procedures for that committee.

REVIEW BY STANDING COMMITTEE

- 6. The Director will present to Standing Committee on a minimum of two separate occasions for any land use plan development, review, or amendment, unless otherwise directed by the Standing Committee.
- 7. Prior to completing substantial work to develop, review, or amend a land use plan, the Director will present to Standing Committee a proposal to plan. A proposal will outline:
 - a. whether the activity is to develop a proposed plan, or review or amend a land use plan;
 - the potential for the proposed plan or land use plan to affect zoning, or development of Settlement Land, or the granting of an interest in Settlement Land;
 - c. the rationale for the development, review, or amendment, as the case may be;
 - d. if applicable, the proposed nature of collaboration between KDFN and another organization or government;
 - e. proposed involvement of Citizens and Beneficiaries;
 - f. proposed involvement of Standing Committee, which may include a description of factors that may affect the frequency or nature of review; and
 - g. anticipated timelines, resources, and budget.
- 8. Having considered the presentation of the proposal for work, or at any other time, Standing Committee may provide direction on, but not limited to, the following:
 - a. whether to pursue the proposed plan;
 - b. the content of the proposed plan;
 - c. engagement of Citizens and Beneficiaries in the planning work; and
 - d. further review or oversight by the Standing Committee or by other bodies of the KDFN government.

PLAN REVIEW

- 9. A plan review is an exercise to revise, re-write, or repeal an adopted land use plan, either in its entirety, or portions of it.
- 10. The Director may propose a plan review in accordance with Sections 6 to 8 of this policy, such as in the following circumstances:
 - a. Following an interval of time specified in a land use plan;
 - b. In response to new information or circumstances within and outside the land use plan area;

- c. If several similar applications for Settlement land within a land use plan suggest a need for a review;
- d. To improve KDFN's economic or social well-being; and
- e. To protect the environment.

PLAN AMENDMENT

- 11. A plan amendment is a change to a land use designation affecting one or more lots or parcels of Settlement Land in an adopted land use plan.
- 12. The Director shall provide a process by which a person can request an amendment, and by which HLR will review an application.
- 13. Following departmental review and evaluation, the Director may submit a proposal to amend a land use plan to Standing Committee for consideration in accordance with Sections 6 to 8 of this policy.

PUBLIC ENGAGEMENT

- 14. Except as otherwise directed by Standing Committee, in the course of carrying out planning work, the Director will provide, at minimum, the following engagement opportunities:
 - a. for the development of a proposed plan or the review of a land use plan, at least two opportunities for general Citizen and Beneficiary input at each of two stages of planning;
 - b. for the amendment of a land use plan, at least one general notification to Citizens and Beneficiaries.
- 15. The Director will determine the scope and method of engagement and notification based on current standard practices and direction provided by Standing Committee.

PLAN ADOPTION

- 16. Standing Committee may recommend that the Council adopt a proposed plan or an amendment to a land use plan.
- 17. The Council will adopt a proposed plan or an amendment to a land use plan by Order-in-Council.
- 18. Any Order-in-Council adopting a proposed plan will provide for the amendment of Schedule 2 of the *Lands Act* to add the adopted land use plan.
